## News from around the classes

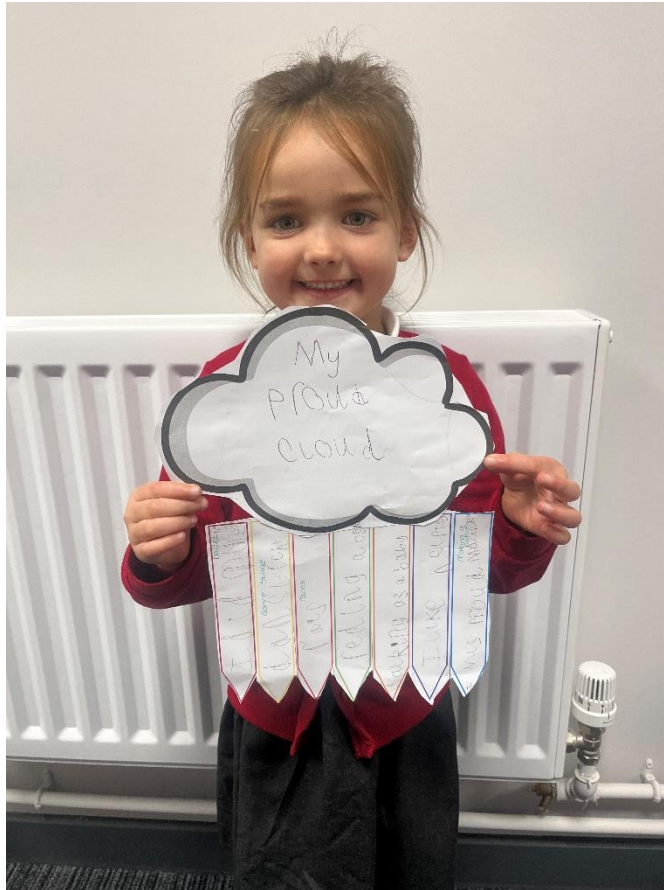
### Robin Class (EYFS)

Not giving up when making a lanyard to be like the grown-ups at school.



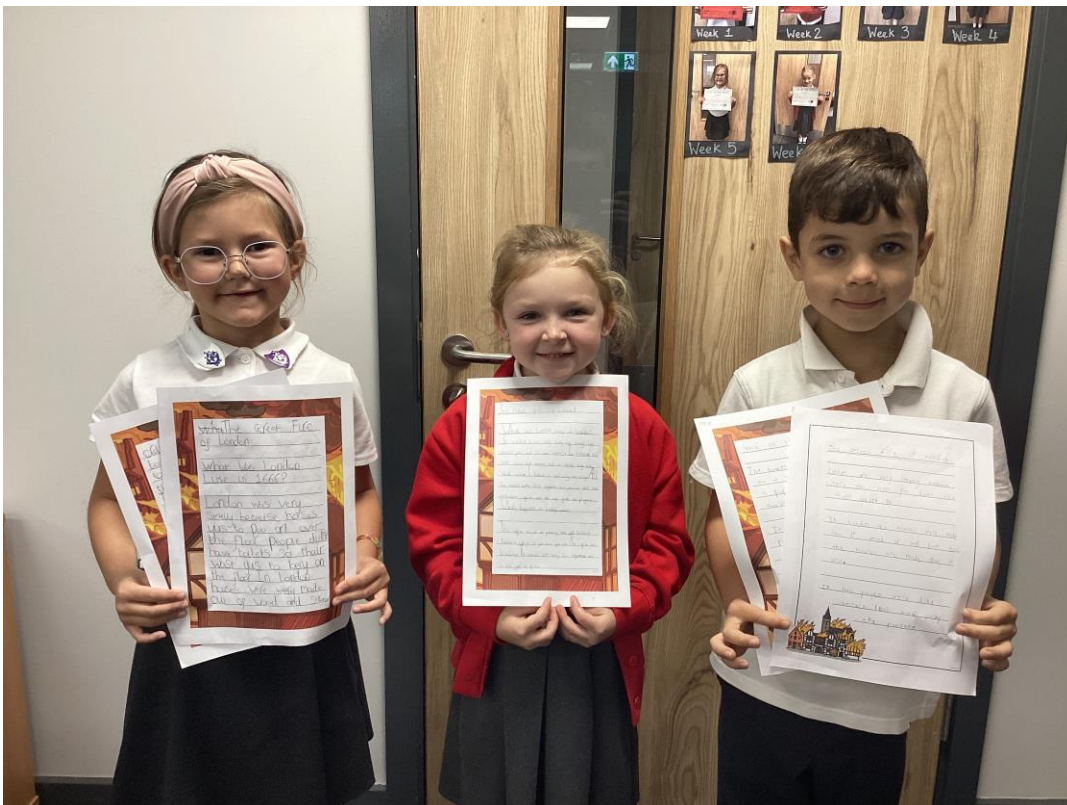
### Swan Class (Y1)
