

Bingham Primary School and Nursery Remote/Distance Learning Plan

This remote/distance learning plan has been developed in the event of a school closure for any reason. This includes severe weather, utility's failure as well As for pupils needing to work from home due to illness.

Learning from home:

- All teachers have a curriculum folder containing the long-term plans for all year groups in school in all subjects.
- From these, the teachers complete medium term plans and weekly plans.
- All plans are saved on the shared drive, enabling all teachers to have access to all plans.
- We use Little Wandle to teach phonics.
- We ask that pupils engage in reading every day. To support reading children will be allocated online books via Little Wandle, which is accessible on a computer, laptop, or smartphone. Staff will allocate reading books according to reading levels. KS2 Children will take their reading book home and can access online books via their Accelerated Reader login. Children from Y2 upwards will be expected to complete a quiz when they have finished reading their book.
- Maths is based around the White Rose Maths resources; these are matched to our current curriculum model.
- Teachers will be able to plan and set appropriate line work in line with the current curriculum primarily supplemented by a range of resources including Waitrose maths times tables rock stars accelerated reader and resources provided by the Oak Academy.
- Children will remain in contact with their class teacher through MS Teams. there will be a
 number of drop-in sessions throughout the day, and these are usually scheduled after
 each subject children will be able to attend these droppings but where devices at home
 are limited it is acceptable for children to attend one or two sessions to receive the
 support they require.
- Teachers will begin lessons when there are at least three pupils or other adults present until this is the case peoples will wait in the online 'lobby'.
- All parents will receive a letter detailing their children's logins and further instructions regarding how to access remote learning platforms.
- Parents are asked to inform school if they do not have the ability to access remote learning so suitable arrangements can be made. In the event of a pupil being loaned hardware the school will ask the parents to sign an @Acceptable use Agreement.'

Class Dojo:

- We use a free online system called 'Class Dojo', which has the facility for parents and teachers to send messages to one another, and for parents to upload photos and videos directly to the class teacher using a 'portfolio'.
- 100% of our parents have access to Class Dojo, and all accounts have been activated.
- Parents and teachers can this system with ease to share work and receive completed work from home.
- Links to Microsoft Teams live lessons will be shared on Class Dojo.

Additional Considerations:

Area to consider	Actions
How do we know if the children are completing the work?	 Teachers will be able to view completed work on Class Dojo. If a parent has not shared work with the teacher, the teacher will send a message to the parent, and a follow up phone call if required. Teachers keep a daily record of work submitted.
How do we see completed work?	Parents can upload photos or videos of completed work directly to their class teachers using a portfolio on Class Dojo.
How can we provide feedback?	 Teachers can send messages, photos or videos of feedback using Class Dojo. Whole class messages etc can be sent, as well as private messages to individual parents.
How does the learning fit with our curriculum?	 Lessons sent remotely to parents will be in line with the curriculum overview. Links to appropriate 'Oak Academy' lessons will also be shared with parents.
How many lessons will be provided each day?	 3 hours of learning will be provided every day, including English and maths. Lessons will be updated on Class Dojo daily. Teachers will send challenges to be completed on Numbots or TTRockstars.
How do we ensure children have the resources they need for remote learning?	 Children have their own stationery set in school, which can be used at home for distance learning. If a bubble closes during the day and children are sent home during the school day, paper / workbooks will be sent home with the children. If a bubble closes before children are in school, paper / workbooks will be left in the foyer, and parents will be able to sign to say they have been collected. In an emergency situation (isolation, so can't leave the house) paper / workbooks will be posted through the letter box at home.
