### **News from around the classes**

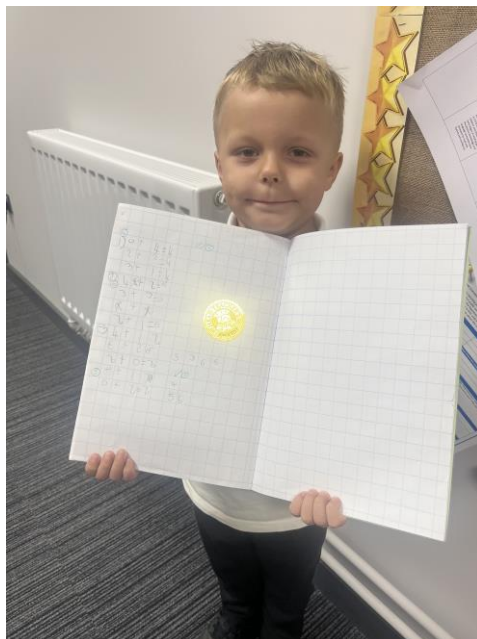
#### **Robin Class (EYFS)**

They have been busy learning new sounds in their phonics and learning their number bonds in Maths. Look at that headteacher sticker shine!!!

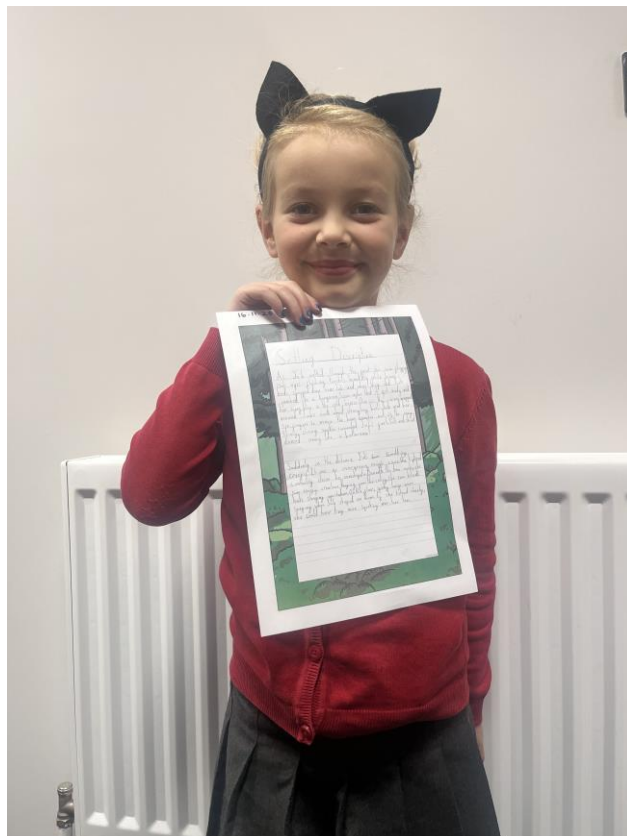


### **Barn Owl Class (Y2)**
